Project Notes - Icicle Xmas tree decoration



top

about 5" long, 5/8" max. diameter, example above made of Holly

- 1. Mount blank between centres, turn to a parallel cylinder using a spindle roughing gouge.
- 2. Mark length of finished icicle, part in at both ends, leaving sufficient wood to support the work.
- 3. Decide which end is going to be the lower end of the icicle, then turn a taper towards that end using roughing gouge, skew chisel or spindle gouge.
- 4. Turn an interesting series of shapes using a spindle gouge.
- 5. Use abrasives to smooth the work.
- 6. Apply a coat of sanding sealer. Allow to dry then rub down with fine abrasive. Apply polish and buff on the lathe.
- 7. Part nearly through at both ends, then saw the rest. Clean up the ends if necessary.
- 8. Make a small hole in the top and insert a small screw eye, with a short length of cord as a hanger.
